Mark your calendars— several learning opportunities this fall for climate supporters with eco-events across the country— and world!



3. **Today, September 14**<sup>th</sup>, the <u>Climate Reality Project</u> will be holding 24 Hours of Reality across the world to bring attention to the scale and impact of the climate crisis. Each hour there will be a climate change presentation broadcasted online in a different time zone starting at 7pm in Mexico City on September 14th and ending in NYC on September 15th. There will be 24 presentations in 24 counties and in 13 languages.



Al Gore, Chairman of the Climate Reality Project, will present the final hour at 7pm Eastern Time on Thursday, September 15<sup>th</sup>. <u>Click here</u> to find event locations. Al Gore describes the project: "24 Hours of Reality will focus the world's attention on the full truth, scope, scale and impact of the climate crisis. To remove the doubt. Reveal the deniers. And catalyze urgency around an issue that affects every one of us."

4. 10 Days of Climate Action (**Sept. 17**<sup>th</sup>-**26**<sup>th</sup>) is an initiative of the <u>The Human Impacts</u> <u>Institute</u> to bring together artists, musicians and performers to install climate-inspired public works throughout New York City. Each day of *10 Days of Climate Action* will present a climate theme and creatively engage the public in positive action around issues of climate change. The events are FREE and open to the public and representatives from the Human Impacts Institute will be on hand to discuss each piece and provide tools for taking local action on curbing climate change.
